#### Jean-Marie Otto, Mustang Public Schools Community Education

Jean-Marie is fighting cancer for the fourth time. She is currently undergoing chemo until her next viable treatment option can begin. Over the years Jean-Marie has worked at North Middle, Canyon Ridge, Meadow Brook, Horizon, and now the MERC. She plays an integral role in the success of the Mustang Community Education program. She has a big personality, she is always in good spirits, and she loves her job and the Mustang community. Her current diagnosis is Non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma and the treatment she will be receiving is Car-T cell therapy. This treatment will mean she will be out of work for 6-8 weeks because she has to self-isolate and must be able to get to the hospital without delay if necessary. Because of the amount of chemo she has had through her life, this is among the last treatment options her body can take. This being her third round of treatment within 3 years it has been a financial hardship, but she keeps a positive attitude about it as best she can. Her faith, family and friends have played a big role in her successful recovery in the past, and we hope the community will rally around her in her time of biggest need.

#### Kerry Villanueva, Kindergarten Teacher at Mustang Valley

Kerry was diagnosed in January with a baseball sized brain tumor. She is now back to teaching Kindergarten at Mustang Valley Elementary School, while still undergoing treatments. She has a freshman at OSU and two other children in the Mustang school district. She gives so much to her school community that she's a perfect candidate to give back to and help with her medical bills as she's still doing chemo treatments while working. She is a fighter and a friend who is always rooting for others, even before she was diagnosed. She is truly amazing!

Since 1997, The Cavett Kids Foundation has provided FREE camps, programs and special events for children battling chronic and lifethreatening illnesses (many who are alumni of Mustang schools). Today, they are now an established non-profit with over 20 years of service and an impact reaching nearly 15,000 children each year. So many of the campers cannot attend a traditional summer camp because there is often nobody qualified to care for them. But at Cavett Kids, they provide a fully staffed volunteer medical team. The camps are truly more than just a camp...they are a place "where illness does not define the child."
